Intro

Narrator:

My people, welcome to the last episode of our Radio Drama, "Family Affairs" about how you can become a political player. Just before today's final episode, the three family members each got a surprise. First, Ronnie was invited to play for the national under-16's football team. Betty was disappointed that her choir was not picked to go and sing in front of the President, even though they won the competition. But Eveline got the biggest surprise when she entered the Town Hall as the new councilor of Milimani. What lies ahead for the three, now? Today it's "Time to Get Started"!

Scene one: At the courthouse

1. JUDGE: Last witness in the corruption charges case facing

the former Member of Parliament is Eveline Mapito,

Councilor for the Milimani ward.

2. EVELINE: I swear to speak the truth, and nothing but the truth.

3. JUDGE: What happened between you and the MP?

4. EVELINE: It's what I've said all along, honorable judge: he

called me on my phone and invited me for coffee.

When I arrived he tried to bribe me with money and

even offered to give me a piece of land if I stepped

down from the contest to win the civic seat for

Milimani.

5. CROWD: NOISY CONVERSATION

6. JUDGE: (shouts) Order! Order in my courtroom. (to

Eveline) Yes, Miss Eveline, go on.

7. EVELINE: Your Honour, I politely declined the MP's offer and

from that moment on he became very angry and

threatened me and my family. Little did he know

that I was recording the whole conversation on my

mobile phone.

8. JUDGE: Would you please play the recording?

SFX: PLAYS THE RECORDED TALK BETWEEN MP AND EVELINE FROM EARLIER ON IN EPISODE FOUR

Thank you Miss Eveline. You may sit. Does the Suspect have anything to say before I pass judgment?

SILENCE...

Member of Parliament, this court finds you guilty on counts of corruption and bribery and sentences you to three years in prison. In addition, the court also requests the Anti-corruption Commission to investigate how the Suspect accumulated so much wealth in such a short time. Case is now closed.

SFX: HAMMER BANGS ONCE

9. NARRATOR: Believe it or not, sometimes, one tiny pebble can

cause discomfort to the whole foot. And yes,

Eveline Mapito was causing many politicians a lot

of discomfort. Listen to what happens later on that

same day at the Mayor's get-to-know-each-other

party.

Scene Two: Mayors Familiarization Party

SFX: PARTY SOUNDS + CLINKING OF GLASSES

10. MAYOR: Maybe we are raising our glasses here and

celebrating our victory but our comrade is in prison

because of this newcomer. We need to do

something before we all end up in the same boat.

11. VOICE: It won't be that easy, Your Excellency. She has

managed to win the admiration of many, including

the members of the International Community. And

now even the journalists seem to like her.

12. MAYOR: She is only 20 years-old, for goodness sake. She

knows nothing about politics

13. VOICE: But that's the whole point. She has a clean record.

People think she is untainted and full of integrity

14. MAYOR: Stop with all that! No-one is clean, not in politics.

Everybody has some hidden skeletons somewhere.

I just need to find out where hers are and then

confront her with them. Then, she will have no

choice. She will either have to join us or resign.

Drink up gentlemen and let's get to work.

SFX: CLINKING OF GLASSES AS WHEN PEOPLE DRINK WINE

15. NARRATOR: The council was under pressure. They had either to

defeat Eveline or get her to join them. As they celebrated and plotted, Ronnie was at his first training session for the National under-16's team.

MUSIC BRIDGE

Scene three: Ronnie's first national training session

SFX: WHISTLE BLOWS

16. RONNIE: (Exhausted) Phew...I am so tired. I never expected that

football training could be this hard, and we haven't

even touched the ball yet. It's like being in the army.

17. BOY: We represent our country now, not our schools, so

we need to be in form, physically and mentally.

18. RONNIE: By the way I'm Ronnie. Ronnie Mapito.

19. BOY: (Not amused) I know. You are the boy from Milimani.

20. RONNIE: (Cheerfully) That's right! I scored lots of goals when...

21.BOY: I know. But here it won't be that easy. Here,

everyone is out for himself and only the Coach for

us all.

22. RONNIE: I'm ready to play and earn the captainship once

again. I noticed I was the only one trying to play as

a team.

23. BOY: Watch your back, otherwise you will be out.

Selection is very competitive.

24. RONNIE: I'm ready. Just remember this is not tennis, it's

football!

25. BOY: What?

26. RONNIE: Nothing, just something someone once told me.

27. NARRATOR: So, my dear people, the battle lines have been

drawn once again but thanks to his old coach and

the experience that Ronnie gained while playing for

his school, he was now ready for a greater

responsibility. And as for our dear Betty...

Scene Four: Mapito's Home

28. BETTY: (singing her song)

29. MAPITO: I haven't got a good memory but it's not the first

time I've heard you singing that song. It sounds so

sweet.

30. BETTY: Dad, I was so scared that you would leave us

alone.

31. MAPITO: No, I'd never do that. How could I leave such a

beautiful daughter like you? Oh, and have you

heard anything from Eveline about your school trip

to State House?

32. BETTY: Nothing yet, but I'm sure she will find a solution.

She is so strong and so determined. I want to be

just like her...or even better, become the President

of our country.

33. MAPITO: (Laughs) Now, that's something! I thought you wanted to

become a singer.

34. BETTY: I wanted to and now I am. But Eveline has made

me realise that I could be whoever I want to be.

35. MAPITO: True. I wish the many young people we arrest

everyday for petty crimes like picking pockets or

excessive drinking would realise their potential and

not waste their youth on harmful and useless practices.

SFX: DOOR OPENS AND CLOSES

36. MAPITO: Oh Eveline, there you are.

37. EVELINE: Dad, how are you feeling?

38. MAPITO: I feel better now that you are here. So, how was

your day?

39. EVELINE: Before I tell you, I have a question that's been

bothered me since the shooting. Dad, do you think

you getting shot was politically motivated? I

remember the MP telling me that I was putting my

life and that of my family in danger by not taking his

bribe.

40. MAPITO: What in the world are you talking about? Didn't the

people at the station tell you?

41. EVELINE: Tell me what? They just took me to the hospital.

42. MAPITO: Eve, this was an accident, I was cleaning my gun

and it accidently fell and fired. This was not a

robbery or a political shooting. Girl, you are not that popular yet. (Laughs)

43. EVELINE: Ah, Betty! I forgot. I have some good news for you.

44. MAPITO: All my children. They all just keep making news!

That's right, Eveline had made the news. The news that a young nineteen-year-old had got a corrupt MP sent to prison. And she was promising to usher in a new era of politics that hopefully would benefit everyone.
