## <u>Intro</u>

Narrator: Hello and welcome to our continuing story of

Family Affairs – How to Become a Political

Leader, the Learning by Ear series on political

participation. In our last episode, Eveline, who

is running for councillor in the local elections,

rejected the offer of the Member of Parliament

who offered to give her money to end her

campaign. She even recorded the

conversation and later had the Member of

Parliament arrested for bribery. Her younger sister Betty went through a tough battle for leadership of her choir and their brother Ronnie got advice from his father about his football training. Keep your ears open as we find out is it "**True or false**" in today's episode.

Scene one: Mapito's home. (Girls bedroom)

SFX: COCK CROWS, EARLY BIRD SOUNDS

1. **Betty** (humming a song while reading the

newspaper)

SFX: NEWSPAPER SHUFFLING

**2. EVELINE:** (tired) Betty, please be guiet...I'm still in bed.

**3. BETTY:** Sorry, Sis, I was just exercising my voice.

SFX: SOUND OF NEWSPAPER BEING SHUFFLED

**4. BETTY**: Eve! Eve! Look, there's a picture of you in the

paper. Let me read out what they say about

you!

**6. EVELINE**: Oh, can't it wait until I'm awake? OK, read it.

7. **BETTY**: (Reads aloud) "TEENAGE POLITICIAN

TRICKS MP INTO ARREST"

8. **EVELINE**: (suddenly awake, shocked) Whaat!!

**9. BETTY**: That's just the headline, there's more...

(Continues to read) "Eveline Mapito, a civic

contestant for Milimani seat is believed to

have tricked the Member of Parliament into a

conversation that has led to his arrest on

charges of corruption, bribery and

intimidation."

**10. EVELINE**: (**Utterly shocked**) Give me that!

SFX: NEWSPAPER IS GRABBED

Oh my God! It's over! I told the journalist the truth but they twisted the story so now I'm the guilty one. No one will ever believe in me again.

11. **BETTY**: Hey, don't say that, we believe in you.

12. **EVELINE**: No, Betty, you don't get it, I had planned a meeting today with the religious leaders and business people to convince them that I'm the best candidate for Milimani. But now it's useless if they've all read this.

13. **BETTY**: (**breathes hard**) I'm sorry. Don't know how to help. I have my own battle to win in the choir. Aah, maybe Dad can help. Eh?

14. **EVELINE**: Dad is still mad at me because I didn't tell him about the meeting with the MP. I have to solve this on my own. There has to be a way for me to clear my name.

15. **BETTY**: Eve, your name is as clear as our sky. It's the people who wrote this, that must admit that you didn't tell any lies and apologize to you.

16. **EVELINE**: You are right about that, Betty. Let me start preparing for the meeting. I will not let what the newspaper said stop me from progressing with my campaign.

17. **NARRATOR**: It's true what they say: When the going gets tough, only the tough get going. Later that

same day, Ronnie swallowed his pride and rejoined his football team even though he was not chosen to be their coach as he had hoped..

### Scene two: At the football practice

### **SFX: FOOTBALL TRAINING**

18. **BOY**: Hey! ... Look who is coming...

19. **BOYS**: Ronnie! (They call out his name)

20. **SAMU**: So you decided to come back, did you?

(sarcastic) Did you miss us? Because we

sure didn't miss you at all! Your absence was

extremely highly appreciated. You are out of

the team Ronnie!

21. **RONNIE**: Sorry Samu, but only the Coach can decide

that, not you.

22. **SAMU**: (**Firmly**) I am now the Captain! And when Coach isn't here I make the decisions. And I've decided: I

don't want you in my team! (Starts fighting

with Ronnie)

- 23. **BOYS** Shouting while Samu and Ronnie are fighting
- 24. COACH: (tried to be heard over the noise) What's going on here? Hey, you, Samu, you are the Captain, can you explain to me why the ball isn't here and why...oh Ronnie, you're here too, I thought you had quit. You've got a bruise. Now don't tell me you just came back to start a fight?!
- **25. BOY**: (**Bit scared of Samu**) Coach, it's not Ronnie, it's Samu, sorry, Captain Samu who started the fight.
- **26. COACH**: Is that true boys? Did Samu start this?
- **27. BOYS**: Yes Coach!
- 28. COACH: Samu, I gave you the leadership of this team not because you are better than Ronnie or any of the other players. I thought it would make you more responsible, teach you humility and how to put the team's needs ahead of yours. I see I was wrong, power has made you cruel, ruthless and undisciplined, even violent! This

team is more divided than ever and they can't even speak freely for fear of you. I'm releasing you of your duties as Captain and suspending you until you show a change for the better.

- **29. SAMU**: (**Rudely**) Aaaah, (**Spits**) I don't care, I never wanted to captain a bunch of losers anyway!
- **30. RONNIE**: Samu, this isn't over yet, I'm reporting you to the Head Teacher after practice.
- **31. COACH**: Samu, I want you to leave the practice. Now!
- 32. SAMU: (Goes away cursing his team) Losers...! Losers...!
- 33. COACH: This is something I should have done earlier.

  Ronnie, you are now Captain! You deserve it,
  now get the ball and let's start practice, boys...

SFX: WHISTLE BLOWS

34. NARRATOR: In such unusual circumstances Ronnie made leader of his team. At the village hall, however, where the meeting with the religious leaders and business people was being held, things were a bit hot for our Eveline.

### Scene three: At the village social Hall.

### **MUSIC BRIDGE**

#### **34A. NOISY CROWD**

- 35. Announcer: (Testing microphone) One...two...mike check!
  One two, one two (clearing his throat) Our
  area chief, religious leaders, invited guests,
  ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to this
  meeting organised by our very own Eveline
  Mapito!
- 36. CROWD: (Shouts) Liar! Liar! Liar!
- 37. Announcer: Please, let us not turn this meeting into some kind of demonstration, let's keep in mind that our Constitution states that one is innocent until proven guilty by a court of law. So, what we read today is still under investigation. It's my pleasure to invite Eveline Mapito to address you.
- 38. CROWD (Some boo Eveline)

#### **38A. SOME APPLAUSE**

#### 39. EVELINE:

Thank you. Well, first let me say I'm very honoured to be standing in your presence. I never thought I would get this far in my campaign. A lot of people say to me, aren't you too young to be in politics? My answer is always the same. Politics isn't about age, it's about improving lives of those who chose you to lead them. It's a commitment to put their interests ahead of yours. That's why I'm running for councillor.

#### 39A. LIGHT APPLAUSE

#### 40. EVELINE:

I called you here to seek your support and votes and also to reassure you that once elected, I intend to serve everyone equally regardless of tribe, religion, gender, age or social status. I'm going to battle corruption and mismanagement of public resources from the very first day I'm elected.

#### 40.A HUGE APPLAUSE

**41. JOURNALIST**: Excuse me, I'm the journalist who interviewed

you during the clean-up, I'm sure most people

are dying to hear the truth. Is it true or false

that you tricked our MP into corruption

charges so that you could become the popular

candidate?

## 42. CROWD (NOISES OF SUPPORT FOR THE QUESTION)

**43. EVELINE**: I wish I could comment on that but I'm not

permitted to, by law, as it's an on-going case.

But what I can say is this; judge me by what I

do, not by what newspapers say about me.

You should know that the newspaper which

published this report is owned by the MP

himself and they've already called me to

apologise for the story.

# 44. CROWD: (Now in a frenzy) EVELINE! EVELINE!
