common solutions for the future.

In today's episode, the women report on the planting and the valuable

medicinal herbs that are still in the forest. Meanwhile there is high

drama in Dovani Camp. Little Akiki has disappeared. Will she find her

sister?

Join us now as Talib explains how little Akiki was suddenly nowhere to

be found.

Episode SEVEN: "LOCAL SOLUTIONS."

1.MUSIC UP

Scene 1

2.TALIB NARRATOR: The news hit us all like a bombshell. Akiki had run away. The first thing we heard last night was MaKipko and Isingoma screaming....

3.INSERT: FADE IN SFX EVENING AMBIENCE/HOLD MUSIC UNDER

4.MOTHER: (very upset) Akiki? **(sobbing)** Isi? Where is she? It is

dark. Her cow is here but she is not.

5.ISI: I don't know ma. I'll go and look for her. Don't

worry!

6.ISI RUNNING CALLING OFF MIC: AKIKI! AKIKIKI!

7.MOTHER CALLING OFF MIC: AKIKI! AKIKI

8. Background voices of men and women asking what's wrong

9.MOTHER: screaming Akiki's gone! She's gone!

10.FADE SOUNDS. END OF INSERT

11.TALIB NARRATOR: ...We alerted the rest of Dovani refugee camp and everyone joined in a massive search. But we couldn't find her. MaKipko and Isingoma are of course especially upset because they had adopted Akiki. Now all the mothers are rallying round to support them both and Chika is with them.

Scene 2

12.SFX Morning ambience outside

13.WOMEN'S VOICES CONSOLING MAKIPKO: Don't worry ma; she'll

be alright; she's smart.

14.MOTHER: But why did she run away? Where has she

gone?

15.ISI: Ma, I think she got an idea from the story you told

her about the old man hiding in the Lenge tree. Akiki thinks that her sister could be hiding in that

big Lenge tree in Abanto.

16.MOTHER: Oh my goodness. Has she really gone there?

17.CHIKA: (gently) No one knows MaKipko but standing here won't

help. The men are out searching in jeeps. Please

go home.

18.CHORUS OF WOMEN ALL AGREEING NOT TO WORRY

19.CHIKA: Ai. Ladies. We said we would collect medicinal

herbs and roots for our clinic. We need to report back on our findings. Are you willing to go out without me? I need to write up the last meetings

minutes.

20.WOMEN Yes Chika. We can go. No problem. Let's go.

21.MUSIC UP

Scene 3

22.SFX Morning ambience outside

23.MULOGO: Hallo Chika. You look miserable. Can I cheer you

up?

24.CHIKA: Oh hallo Mulogo! I need to write up the minutes

from the last meeting. But you can make me

some tea if you like.

25.MULOGO: On that rocket stove?

26.CHIKA: (laughing) Yes...we are passing the stove around so

everyone can get to use it. It's my turn today.

Can you work it?

27.MULOGO: Of course. You do your work. I'll get this going!

28.SFX: Grass, wood, striking of match

29.MULOGO: I'm impressed! It's cleaner than the old metal

charcoal stove we had back home. My father's

quite clever after all!

30.SFX flames burning sticks

31.MULOGO: Listen Chika? I know maybe now is not the right

time...

32.CHIKA: Oh?

33.MULOGO: (laughing) I am actually busy thinking about the

future....

34.TALIB (OFF MIC) Hah. There you are Chika! Oh...hallo Mulogo!

Making tea? Great! Or am I disturbing?

35.CHIKA: (embarrassed) Uh..um...no..no Talib. Not at all! Umm..

Look.I really have to work! The women's meeting

is soon. I'll go and work inside. You guys talk

here outside!

36.SFX: FOOTSTEPS DEPARTING

Scene 4

37. SFX Same ambience as Scene before (morning ambience)

38.TALIB: Sorry. I came at the wrong time. I didn't know

that you and she...um...well...it's none of my business. Well actually it is my business. Chika and I work and get on very well together. I would

hate that to change.

39.MULOGO: Oh? And why should it change?

40.TALIB: Look...I...I like Chika very much.

41.MULOGO: Woa..stop. Too much information. I came to talk

to Chika to say that I have plans for the

future...

42.TALIB: Well then I am right...and I DO have a reason to

worry.

43.MULOGO: What? Oh no! I'm not talking about THAT! I'm

talking about setting up a meeting.

44.TALIB: A meeting?

45.MULOGO: Yes, with you guys!

46.TALIB: With us?

47.MULOGO: Yes! With *Help Africa*. I think Chika took it the

wrong way.

48.TALIB: Oh. And why would she do that?

49.MULOGO: That, my friend, is something that you will have to

ask her. Look....let me put some more sticks on

the flames.

50. SFX: Sticks/flames

51.MULOGO: Right! Now! This is what I am trying to say. I

need to understand how you guys work. I have some great ideas! ONE great idea! I need to

know if *Help Africa* can really HELP!

52.TALIB: Then let's talk later when Chika has more time.

after her women's meeting.

53.MUSIC UP

Scene 5

54. SFX Daytime ambience

55.MOTHER: Ladies. Welcome. And thank you for all your

support this morning. I can't sit at home crying.

56.WOMEN MURMUR IN APPROVAL

57.MOTHER: Who will volunteer to take the minutes?

58.WOMEN MURMUR:

59.CHIKA: Themba? Do I see your hand up?

60.THEMBA: Yes! I'll do it.

61.CHIKA: Oh thank you! That's great! All of you will need to

have these skills later when you start negotiating with the forest stakeholders and government over

land rights. So start practising now! You do it

next time, Alice, OK?

62. SOFT LAUGHTER AMONG WOMEN

63.MOTHER: Now! According to our agenda we have two

reports: one form the soya planting group and one from the medicinal herbs group. Chika. I

believe you are first.

64.CHIKA: Yes! Right! Well, we had a planting session this

morning and finished ten rows of soya. It's just the right time of year. The soil is warm and loose. It is better since we added organic mulch and sand. The clay was too hard before for planting.

65.THEMBA: You cannot believe how neat the rows look!

66.MOTHER: When the plants are fully grown the canopy will

completely cover the spaces between the rows.

That's good for growth.

67.CHIKA: And the oil press that *Help Africa* is making

available to the camp will help us to manufacture

soya cooking oil.

68.MOTHER: It is all excellent news! Thank you. And from the

women who went into the forest?

69.CHIKA: I can report that the ladies brought back six large

baskets of kapok bark, mint and ginger. We can definitely be happy that the fauna and flora in the forests to the west are still intact. As long as we keep the forests intact too we should have plenty

of herbs for all our needs.

70.MOTHER: Congratulations ladies, on a wonderful day's

work.

71. FADE ON WOMEN CLAPPING

Scene 6

72. SFX Daytime ambience outside

73.MULOGO: Hah, here comes Chika. How was the meeting?

74.CHIKA: Oh it was great! We have made a lot of progress.

Am I disturbing anything?

75.MULOGO: No, not at all. Please Chika. Sit down. I want to

ask you and Talib if Help Africa also helps local

community enterprises to get started on a

development program that is meant to bring profit

and income to the community.

76.CHIKA: I don't think we have the funds. We too need

funding and we rely on the bigger fish to finance

our projects, you know.

77.TALIB: But we do talk about forming partnerships. What

exactly do you have in mind Mulogo?

78.MULOGO: We know the use of traditional firewood for fuel is

depleting our forests, and that burning wood indoors causes serious breathing problems especially for the women who do the cooking.

79.CHIKA: And for their children.

80.TALIB: Right, but there are also environmental reasons.

Don't forget how valuable our trees are for our water, for sheltering or plants and cattle. They

give off moisture and oxygen.

81.MULOGO: You and Chika convinced me on that a long time

ago Talib. But to save the trees, we need clean alternative fuels. I've been reading that we can burn waste products- cow dung, human waste, old crops – on a scale that benefits a small

community. I can show you. Here.

82.SFX PAPER NOISE

83.CHIKA: Yes. Talib and I have often talked about

biodigesters. We visited a project once. The biodigester was built underground and the methane gas that came out of the process of burning waste was used for heat, light and

cooking.

84.MULOGO: The beauty of it is, it is clean, easy fuel for rural

communities, it is good for the atmosphere too. Look! According to these figures, it takes a total investment of between 400 and 800 EUROS for

one biodigester in Africa.

85.TALIB: Hmm. What you are asking is whether *Help*

Africa would invest in a biodigester scheme...

86.CHIKA: ... and support a profit-making social enterprise.

87.MULOGO: In a nut shell, yes.

88.CHIKA: As with all these things Mulogo, one has to come

up with a careful business plan, a cost-effective

analysis.

89.MUSIC UP

Scene 7

90. SFX Evening ambiecne / Sound of lorry approaching

91.ISI: What's going on? A lorry? At this time?

92.ISI PANTING AND RUNNING / LORRY ENGINE BECOMES LOUDER

93.MOTHER: (OFF MIC) I heard it too. There's the driver. Ask him.

94.ISI: (shouting above the engine) Hey...did you see a young girl?

95.MOTHER: He can't hear you. Look...over there! There she

is - .It's Akikisomeone else is with her...and

another girl.

96.SFX RUNING AND PANTING

97.CHIKA: MaKipko...lsi...she's safe. Akiki is safe....

98.ISI: Oh thank God.

99.MOTHER: (sobbing) Akiki my darling!

100.AKIKI: (joyful) Ma! I found her...like in my dream...the driver

took me there!

101.ISI: Sesi? You found your missing sister Sesi?

102.MOTHER: And my husband? My sons?

103.ISI: Kato? Did you see my brother Kato?

104.CHIKA: Shh. I'm afraid you will have to wait. Sesi's in

shock. She can't speak. The driver told me they found her huddled inside a tree in the forest. Akiki

knew exactly where to look.

105.AKIKI: (sounding very weak and tired) Yes. I knew where she

was. Oh Isi, I found her. Like Ma said. In the

Lenge tree!

SCENE 8

106. SFX Same ambience as before

107.MULOGO: (gently) Come Chika.

108.CHIKA: (Gentle/surprised) Mulogo!

109.MULOGO: I'll make tea for us and we can warm up a bit.

110.CHIKA: Yes.. thank you. I would like that. It's been a long

long night! Thank God it ended happily!

111.MULOGO: Yes..but you and I need to talk...about us.

112.MUSIC UP

OUTRO.

And that's all from today's *Learning By Ear* series "If a tree falls...", written by Romie Singh, which tackles the question of deforestation. So Sesi has returned safely but is too traumatized to speak. In our next episode, Isi feels being a twin has brought a curse on the family.
