INTRO:

Hello, everybody! This is our new Learning by Ear-radio drama called "The Lost Kid – the Story of Single Mothers in Africa". In our last episode, Kassech had quarrelled with her younger brother Jonas because he left the house in the middle of the night. As she came back to her house and entered her room, she shouted out loud in shock! But why? You'll find out in our second episode entitled "Looking for Begidu". Let's meet the two young single mothers, Kassech, and her friend, Askale. It's early in the morning and both of them are looking forward to a cup of hot tea at Askale's home.

SCENE ONE: MORNING AT ASKALE'S HOUSE

1. SFX: MORNING AMBIENCE FROM OUTSIDE

2. SFX: TEA BOILING

3. Kassech: (Cries) My child disappeared, Askale, my only

child disappeared! Oh! What a misery!

4. Askale: Sit down , Kassech, please.

5. SFX: PULLING A CHAIR

6. Kassech: (Cries) When I woke up last night, my door

was open!

7. Askale: At night?!

8. Kassech: At midnight!

9. Askale: Who did that, a thief?

10. SFX: POURING TEA IN THE CUP

11. Kassech: No, it was my brother!

12. Askale: Jonas?

13. Kassech: Yes.

14. Askale: Why?

15. Kassech: I don't know why, Askale. He simply opened

the door and went outside. I followed him but

he refused to come back inside!

16. Askale: Astonishing! (**She sips the tea**) But why?

17. Kassech: He pretended to be a sleepwalker but I guess

he'd planned to do something. Tell me, do I

look after my brother Jonas and my son Begidu

so badly?

18. Askale: No, that's not true at all, Kassech. And your

son Begidu is safe, so stop worrying. He didn't

really disappear yesterday. He just slept at our

landlord Papa Tilahun's place.

19. Kassech: Oh, thank God. Let me go and see him.

20. Askale: Wait a moment! I know you want to be a good

mother, but I must admit that you should take

better care of your little boy. He needs your

care, and above all he needs your love!

21. Kassech: What do you mean?

22. Askale: My child Samy told me that Begidu is always

asking him to give him some of his sandwiches

or fruit.

23. Kassech: What! You get me to sit here because you

wanna tell me all of that? Thanks a lot, my

friend. I have other things to worry about (she

stands up).

24. SFX: PULLING A CHAIR

25. Askale: Wait, Kassech! I don't know why you always

run away when we talk about your child?

26. Kassech: What do YOU want to tell me about MY child?

27. Askale: I know both of us are poor, but still we have a

lot to give them.

28. Kassech: Do you think that I don't love my son?

29. Askale: No, that's not what I mean. But you know, even

though my son Samy is one year younger than

Begidu, he is better at basic mathematics, he

knows the alphabet, and he's better at

expressing himself.

30. Kassech: (Angrily) Great!

31. Askale: I give him lots of attention. We do his

homework together, I play his favorite game

with him and he tells me if something is

bothering him, or if he is proud of something he

did.

32. Kassech: (Sarcastically) So, congratulations on your

well-behaved and clever son!

33. SFX: WALKING TO THE DOOR

34. SFX: SLAMS THE DOOR

35. ASKALE: (SIPS THE TEA)

36. NARRATOR:

While Askale sips her tea, she thinks about her friend's behavior. She had also wanted to ask Kassech why she dropped out of evening classes, but Kassech stormed out of the room before she could tackle the subject.

SCENE TWO: MORNING AT BELETU'S HOUSE

37. SFX: MORNING AMBIENCE

38. SFX: DOOR KNOCKING

39. Papa Tilahun (Prays in a low voice).

40. Mama Beletu: Come in, the door's open.

41. Papa Tilahun: (Still praying in a low voice) Who is it?

42. Mama Beletu: Are you praying or watching the door?

43. Papa Tilahun: (Prays in a low voice).

44. SFX: DOOR OPENING

45. Mama Beletu: Oh! Minabu, there you are. Come over here.

46. Minabu: (In a low voice) Good morning, Mama Beletu!

47. Mama Beletu: Good morning!

48. Minabu: (whispers) Oh, Papa Tilahun is praying. I'll

come back later.

49. Papa Tilahun: No, no, wait! I've finished.

50. Mama Beletu: But you just started praying!

51. Papa Tilahun: It's OK, I'll finish my prayers later.

52. Minabu: (In a polite manner) Good morning, Sir!

53. Papa Tilahun: He, he, he! At first light, you seem like an

angel, but at night, you turn back into a devil!

54. Minabu: I came to tell you that I'm so sorry, Papa

Tilahun.

55. Papa Tilahun: Look! Minabu, if you keep disturbing the

neighbors at night, I can't keep you as my

tenant! I mean it!

56. Minabu: I promise, I'll stop!

57. Papa Tilahun: Well, it's harder to search for a house to rent

than it is to make such a promise. I've finished,

you can go! (Minabu leaves).

58. SFX: DOOR OPENS AND CLOSES

59. Mama Beletu: Minabu is an educated man; you shouldn't treat

him like a child.

60. Papa Tilahun: It makes no difference to me if he keeps getting

drunk and disturbing the neighbors. (Prays in

a low voice).

61. Mama Beletu: But...

62. Papa Tilahun: No buts! Let me finish my prayers now. (Prays

in a low voice).

63. NARRATOR:

It's always the same. Minabu gets drunk and annoys the neighbors at night; then the next day morning, just before the first rooster's shrill cry, he runs to landlord Papa Tilahun with his usual apologies and promises.

But now, let's take a look at the two teenagers, who the drunkard Minabu saw in the darkness yesterday. It's 16-year-old Mekete and his friend Challa, who is one year older. And guess who's with them - Kassech's brother Jonas.

SCENE THREE: MORNING IN THE SUBURB

64. SFX:

69. Challa:

65. SFX:	DOG BARKS
66. Jonas	Either feed that dog a piece of bread or some poison!
67. Challa:	Hey! Bobbie, go away! (Throws a stone and hits the dog).
68. SFX:	DOG WHINES AND RUNS AWAY

MORNING AMBIENCES

70. Mekete: Last night, the drunkard almost detected us!

We can't plan anything with that stupid dog

71. Challa: Just because of this hungry dog!

around!

72. Jonas: One way or another, our plan didn't work.

73. Challa: (Laughs) But I like the way you pretended to be a sleepwalker last night. Nice acting, immediately after your nephew discovered the open door.

74. Mekete: (Laughs) Yes, that was cool! And now you're

free from the prison of your sister's house. You can stay at our home as long as you want; I've

already persuaded my father to let you.

75. Jonas: OK, we couldn't break into Papa Tilahun's

house yesterday. I think we need to look for

another rich man who lives in our suburb.

KW begin

76. Challa: Yes! I agree!

77. Mekete: Cool!

78. SFX: DOG APPROACHES, BARKING

79. Challa. Oh! This miserable dog, again... (Throws a

stone and hits the dog again).

80. SFX: DOG WHINES AND RUNS AWAY

KW end

81. Narration: The three teenagers decided that for their next attempted robbery, they would break in the house of Mr. Kasu, a very wealthy man. Meanwhile, Kassech is on her way to the house of her landlords, Mama Beletu and Papa Tilahun, in search of her lost kid.

SCENE FOUR: AT BELETU'S HOUSE

82. SFX: MORNING AMBIENCES

83. Papa Tilahun: Well, Kassech, if you want to stay here as a

decent tenant, you should know that we can't

accept this kind of behavior anymore!

84. Mama Beletu: I already told her that while you were praying.

She really regrets her behaviour.

85. Kassech: I beg both of you to accept my apologies.

(cries). It was just all too much for me

yesterday.

86. Mama Beletu: Don't cry, my child, you told me everything.

87. Papa Tilahun: Whatever she told you, I can't allow the

neighbors to be disturbed anymore! Besides,

you have to treat your child properly! If our

granddaughter hadn't found your son, Begidu,

in the kitchen last night, what would have

happened then?

88. Kassech: (sobs then cries) I work very hard every day

to feed three mouths, and I also have to save

some money so I can go back to evening

school.

89. Papa Tilahun: Of course, my dear, we know how hard you

work!

90. Kassech: I look after Begidu, I see that he has enough to

eat. But he shouldn't need extra things that I

can't afford! I grew up the same way!

91. Papa Tilahun: You see, that's the point!

92. Mama Beletu: Yes, we also grew up like that. But we shouldn't

treat our children the same way that we have

been treated, if we have the chance to do it

better.

93. Papa Tilahun: Right! We shouldn't! Mama Beletu, don't you

remember what our son told us last time we

were in Europe on vacation? He told us how

important it is for parents to bring up their

children in a positive way.

94. Mama Beletu: I remember everything he said!

KW BEGIN

He told us about their kindergarten and how

much the nursery school teachers encourage

the children. Almost every little child there goes

to kindergarten.

95. Papa Tilahun: Genau! (laughs)

96. Mama Beletu: By the way, our son told us the German word

"genau" means "true".

97. Papa Tilahun: Exactly.

98. Mama Beletu: Properly,

99. Papa Tilahun: Accurately,

100. Mama Beletu: And correct!

101. Papa Tilahun: So, nurturing your child correctly doesn't

depend on whether you're poor or wealthy, it

depends on how you use your mind.

102. Mama Beletu: Genau! (Both laugh).

103. Papa Tilahun: If you want to raise your child to be strong and

happy, you need to spend time with your child.

Some of the most important ways you can

support your child's mental early development

is by answering all of the questions the child

asks without being impatient, by telling fables

and helping your child with his homework.

104. Mama Beletu: If we neglect our children today, later on they'll

be a big burden to society.

105. Papa Tilahun: That is what we learnt from our son. By the

way, Begidu is a very anxious child compared

to other children. That is often a sign that a

child is lacking confidence. You can make him

confident by showing him your love!

106. Kassech: OK! Can I take him home with me now?

107. Papa Tilahun: Sure! He's playing in the room next door with

Aster, our granddaughter.

108. Mama Beletu: (Walks to the next room and calls) Aster!

Aster! Aster!
