INTRO:

Hello and welcome to Deutsche Welle's educational drama programme 'Learning by Ear'. We're on the fourth episode of our continuing story of sexual violence in Africa, '**Trust Betrayed'**. In the last episode, Dulu had to rush his wife to hospital. He found her lying beside the waterhole; she had suffered serious injuries during a vicious sexual attack. And at Kilindi High School, the young student Pato was sexually molested by Mr. Maneno, the boarding master, who's also her Biology teacher. What twists and turns await us now? Stick around to find out in today's episode, '**Aftermaths'**. We begin at the home of 10-year-old Allan. It's late in the evening, and his mother has gone to work, leaving Allan in the care of her new boyfriend, Uncle Joe. Remember, in the last episode Uncle Joe physically abused Allan, giving him a violent beating.

SCENE ONE: ALLAN AT HOME WITH UNCLE JOE

- 1. SFX: MUSIC PLAYING FROM FM RADIO STATION
- **2. JOE:** (Shouts) Allan! What did I tell you about playing loud music?
- 3. NO REPLY MUSIC CONTINUES
- 4. JOE: Allan! I'm talking to you! What did I tell you last time about playing loud music? I told you to turn the volume down! The neighbours don't want to hear what you're listening to. ... I said turn that thing down! Right now!

5. SFX: MUSIC IS TURNED DOWN BUT CONTINUES IN BACKGROUND

6. JOE: And since you've decided you're not speaking

today, I want you to go to the bathroom, take a

shower, and go to sleep. Is that clear? (Pause) ... I

said is that clear?

7. ALLAN: (softly and fearfully) Yes.

8. JOE: Oh good, so you can still talk. Now go. And make

sure you wash yourself properly.

9. NARRATOR: Little Allan is living in a nightmare. This man his mum introduced to him as Uncle Joe is more cruel to him than anyone he's ever met. But unfortunately Allan's about to find out that the beating Uncle Joe gave him was only the beginning. Allan does what he's told, and goes to take a shower...

10. SFX: SHOWER RUNNING

11. ALLAN: (singing song that previously was on radio)

12. SFX: CREAKING SOUND AS WHEN OLD DOOR IS OPENED

13. JOE: (excited) Well, well, look who's here! It's our little

boy!

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14. ALLAN: (protesting) Uncle Joe! Get out! I'm in the shower! ... Uncle Joe... What are you doing? (continues

sceaming)

15. NARRATOR: For many Africans, sex is still a taboo topic. And so it's hardly spoken about. Not by fathers to their sons, not by mothers to their daughters. So it's no surprise that sexual abuse is almost never discussed in African homes. For many people it simply doesn't exist - until it happens to them. Uncle Joe is taking advantage of this, and of Allan's vulnerability. A young boy has been placed in his care, but instead of protecting Allan, he has sexually abused him. What will happen now? We'll soon find out... In another part of the country, Nuru is in hospital after being brutally raped. She's been unconscious for a while, and when she wakes up, her husband Dulu is at her side.

SCENE TWO: NURU RECOVERS IN HOSPITAL

16. SFX: HOSPITAL ATMO

17. NURU: (yawning)

18. DULU: Nuru, my dearest wife. It's so wonderful to see you

wake up.

19. NURU: (slowly coming to) Dulu ... What happened? Why

am I in hospital? (starts to weep) Oh no...Please

say it can't be true... I don't want to remember any

of it!

20. DULU: Don't cry, Nuru. It's all right now. You're safe with

me. Nuru, please... don't cry.

21. SFX: HOSPITAL CURTAIN DRAWN

22. DR. JITO: Oh, good - I see Nuru is awake. I... I have some

news for you both.

23. DULU: Doctor, can't it wait for a while?

24. DR. JITO: No, I'm sorry, I'm afraid it can't... Nuru - as a doctor,

the hardest part of my job isn't dealing with physical

injuries; it's breaking news like this.

25. NURU: What is it, Doctor? Am I going to die? Is that it?

26. DR. JITO: Nuru – please stay calm. It is very good you came

to the clinic so quickly, however unfortunately...

27. DULU: (shocked) Please don't tell me they've infected her

with HIV!

28. DR. JITO: Please, let me finish. I know this is a very difficult

time for you both. But as a doctor, I have to explain

the situation. As I said it is very good you came so

early, so that we can properly treat your injuries. However, due to the violence of the attack your

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29. (Nuru and Dulu shocked)

30. DULU: What! Oh no... this can't be happening.

31. NURU: (weeping) I'm so sorry, Dulu... I tried, I really

tried... They were too many, too strong.

32. DR. JITO: Please, take heart. I know this is a hard time. We

should all be most grateful that Nuru has survived this awful attack. We can make a final test for HIV

three months after the incident. We'll do our very

best to see that you make a full recovery.

33. DULU: (bitterly) No! Our baby... Our little baby.

34. NURU: Dulu, please don't be angry with me! It wasn't my

fault!

35. DULU: (still bitter) Why us? Why me? Why now? Arrrgh - I

will kill the animals who did this to you!

36. DR. JITO: (coughs to interrupt) Sir... Your wife has been

through a great deal of physical pain and emotional

trauma. We'll do our best here at the hospital to

treat the injuries, but it is also very important to

seek psychological support. For that you need

counselling from a therapist. (whispers to Dulu)

But sir, what your wife needs most is you! People

who have been through an experience like this

need the love and support of those they trust!

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37. DULU: Nuru, my dear, it's all right... I'm sorry, Doctor. It's

just that this is all so ... so painful. Nuru has already

been through so much, and now this... But it's all

right, Nuru... it'll be all right. Get some sleep now.

I'll be back tomorrow.

38. NURU: (calls out sadly) Dulu... you are the best husband

anyone could have... If it weren't for you, I would

have died.

39. DR. JITO: Nuru is right, you know. You reached her just in

time. Any later and she could have died from loss of

blood. But Dulu, your wife needs to rest now. She's

still not out of danger.

40. NARRATOR: Nuru must come to terms with a double tragedy: the sexual violence to which she has been subjected, and the loss of the baby she and her husband Dulu wanted so badly. The doctor says she is more than likely to fully recover physically from the rape. But what will happen to her psychologically and socially? Will Nuru ever feel safe again? Stay tuned to find out. But now let's join Pato, who's visiting her mother Serefa on a weekend break from school. It's late in the morning, but Pato is still in bed.

SCENE THREE: PATO AT HOME WITH HER MOTHER SEREFA

41. SFX: VILLAGE MORNING ATMO OUTSIDE. BREATHING OF PATO SLEEPING DEEPLY

42. SEREFA: (surprised) Pato! Patooo!

43. PATO: (responds sleepily) Hmmmm...

44. SEREFA: I hope you haven't been oversleeping like this at

school. Goodness! It is almost ten o'clock! What's

happened to you? Don't you go for an early

morning run any more?

45. PATO: Mum, please let me sleep a bit longer. I'm tired.

46. SEREFA: Tired? (sarcasm) You're only sixteen and you're

acting as if you were sixty.

47. SFX: BLANKET QUICKLY PULLED OFF THE BED

48. SEREFA: Come on - get up and help me with the cleaning.

We're expecting visitors.

49. PATO: (mumbling) I don't want to see anyone.

50. SEREFA: Pato! What did you just say?

51. PATO: (firmly) Mum, please just leave me alone. You said

when you took me to the school that I was entitled

to some privacy. Well, I need some privacy now.

52. SEREFA: (shocked) Aha... Well... Okay... if you insist. But

you're not sick or anything, are you?

53. PATO: No.

54. SEREFA: So you're fine?

55. PATO: Yes.

56. SEREFA: School also fine?

57. SFX: PATO PULLING BLANKET OVER HEAD

58. PATO: (from under the blanket) Please, Mum, just go. I

need to sleep.

59. SEREFA: (puzzled) I've never known you like this, Pato. If

there's anything I can...

60. PATO: (firmly) Yes, there is something you can do! Leave

me alone, Mum!

61. SEREFA: (politely) Okay, okay, I'll leave you alone. But in

case you've forgotten, I am still your mother. So

watch how you speak to me, young lady. I don't like

your tone of voice.

62. SFX: DOOR BEING CLOSED

63. PATO: (starts to cry quietly under the blanket)

64. NARRATOR: Any mother will tell you that they often find it very hard to relate to their teenage daughters. Serefa is obviously surprised by Pato's unusual behaviour. But she doesn't want the argument to escalate; she thinks Pato's strange mood has something to do with hormonal changes as she turns from a teenager to an adult. She has no idea that Pato is struggling to cope with something very different: she's being sexually abused by her teacher, Mr. Maneno. Meanwhile, in another part of the country, little Allan is lost in a world of his own after the shocking experience of being sexually abused by his so-called Uncle Joe. Today his mother Precious has made lunch for the three of them...

SCENE FOUR: ALLAN, PRECIOUS AND UNCLE JOE AT HOME

65. SFX: LUNCH ATMO, RADIO IN BACKGROUND

66. ALLAN: I'm full.

67. PRECIOUS: What? Allan, you've barely touched your food!

68. ALLAN: I'm full.

69. JOE: Well, he's a big boy now. If he doesn't want to eat,

that's up to him.

70. PRECIOUS: Yes, Joe, I know, but this is Allan's favourite meal.

I'm surprised he doesn't want it. Allan, are you

feeling okay? Are you sure you don't want any

more?

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71. Silence

72. PRECIOUS: Hello! Allan, I'm talking to you!

73. ALLAN: Can I go out?

74. PRECIOUS: No. You know I've told you it's rude to leave the

table before everyone has finished.

75. Silence

76. JOE: Let him go if he wants to. Stop treating him like a

small child.

KW BEGIN

77. **PRECIOUS:** But he *is* a small child. He's only ten. How will he

know how to behave if we don't tell him?

78. JOE: Allan - you can go.

79. ALLAN: Huh?

80. PRECIOUS: This boy! Do you have a hearing problem? You

wanted to go, and Joe - I mean, Uncle Joe - has

said you can go.

81. ALLAN: Did you say that, Uncle Joe?

82. JOE: Yes, Allan. You do what you want. That's what real

men do.

83. SFX: CHAIR BEING DRAGGED SLOWLY

84. PRECIOUS: (lovingly) That's what real men do? Joe, you're

spoiling the boy.

85. JOE: (sharply) What do you mean, I'm spoiling him? In

what way?

86. PRECIOUS: Joe, relax! It was just a joke. I'm so happy to see

how he obeys you and listens to you. It's a dream

come true for me to see the two of you getting

along so well.

OUTRO:

Allan's mum Precious doesn't suspect a thing. Her joyful and loving response to Joe brings us to the end of the fourth episode of our radio drama about sexual abuse.
