The Bully

They recognize their responsibility to combat hate speech and respond with a powerful wave of love and understanding.

The Agitator

The Agitator thrives on spreading confusion and chaos, primarily







through the dissemination of false and misleading information. It's no surprise that it had a field day during the pandemic. With its three spinning heads, it keeps you guessing about the true source of its messages. Beware, it may pretend to be human, but it operates in perfect harmony with algorithms, bots, and automation.

The Agitator can have lifethreatening consequences, as seen in your friend's WhatsApp message about a supposed COVID cure. But our Heroes are adept at comparing various sources and analyzing content to uncover the Agitator's malevolent intentions. They defeated the Agitator and brought its little helpers under control.

The Manipulator

The Manipulator may appear innocent at first, but it can quickly trap you in its web. Its goal is power,







achieved by infiltrating our thoughts with censored, polarizing, and targeted content. Collaborating with the Agitator and using algorithms, it ensures that we only consume and believe what it wants. It creates divisions among people with differing beliefs.
