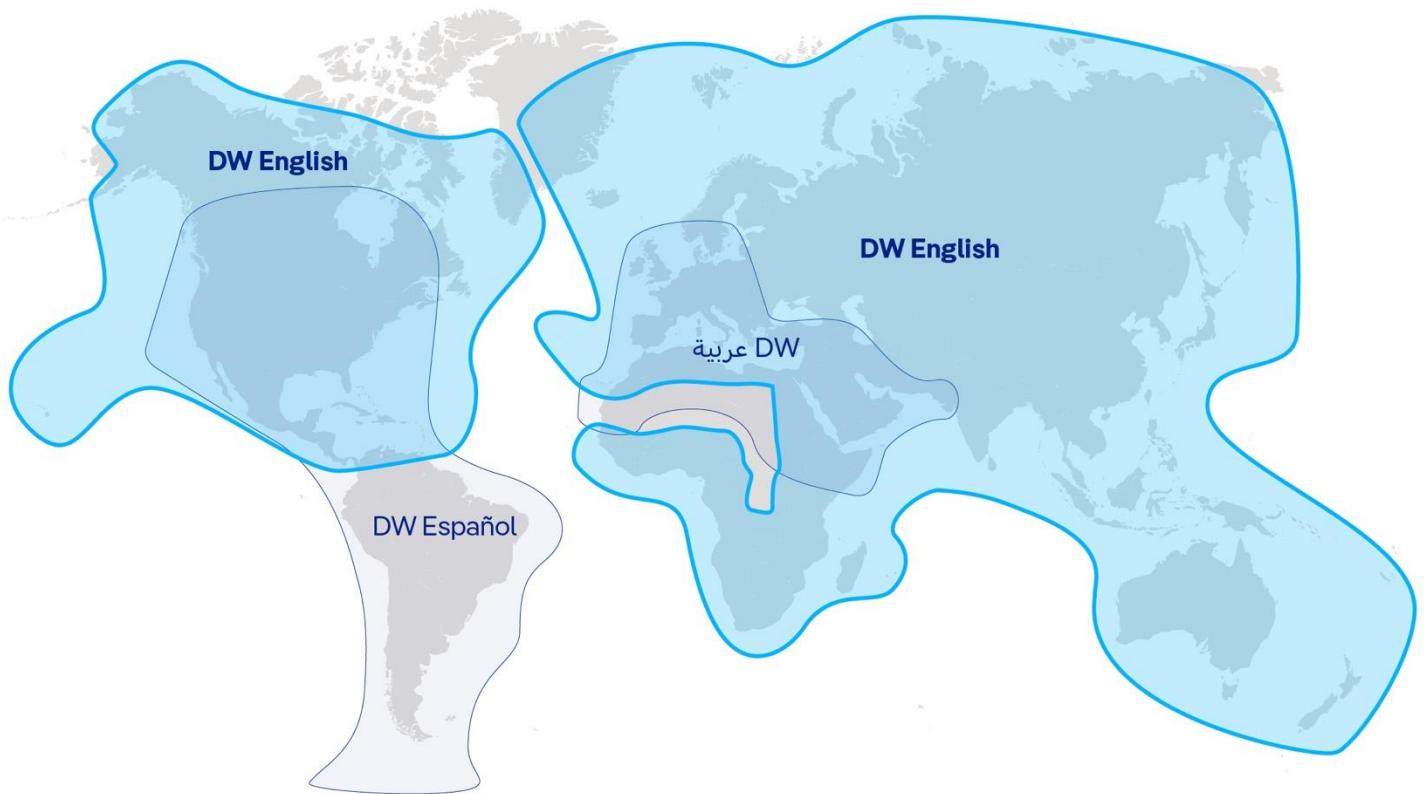

The Beirut Explosion - A Search for Answers**

On 4 August 2020, some 2,750 tons of ammonium nitrate destroyed the Port of Beirut. The explosion killed over 200 people and devastated large parts of the capital city. It was one of the most powerful non-nuclear explosions in history.

To this day, the causes of this disaster remain unclear, and the official investigation has stalled. That's why citizens have launched their own inquiries. They seek to reconstruct a tragedy that may have also been a crime. Examining opaque procedures and warnings that were ignored, they attempt to break the silence.

The investigation traces the path of a ticking time bomb that should never have made its way to Lebanon.

Heart disease, ADHD, mental health: When it comes to medicine, men and women often need different treatments. Yet general medicine is based on the male body.

The risk of dying after a heart attack is twice as high for women as for men.[1] ADHD often goes undiagnosed in girls. For men, mental health issues are still often considered a taboo subject: The suicide rate among men is nearly three times higher than it is among women. [2]

Yet in medical education, drug research, and everyday clinical practice, the standard patient is still imagined as male. In Frankfurt am Main, doctors want to change that.

Germany's first university-affiliated Women's Heart Center was established there. Research and teaching on cardiovascular diseases are focused on women, and personalized therapies and preventive screenings are offered specifically for them.

ADHD, on the other hand, often goes undetected in girls—and thus untreated. Author and influencer Angelina Boerger experienced this firsthand. She wasn't diagnosed until she was 29. More than 150,000 people now follow her accounts of her daily life on her Instagram channel [3]. Through her social media presence, a book, and a live stage show, she is bringing the topic of ADHD in girls and women into the public eye.

Although medical care is more geared toward men, they often stand in their own way when it comes to taking care of their own health. Compared to women, men are less likely to take advantage of preventive health screenings. Even when they already have symptoms, they are less likely to see a doctor. Mental health issues, in particular, are often still considered a taboo subject among men. This is precisely where two programs in Ireland come in: The suicide prevention program "CAIRDE"[4] organizes preventive mental health workshops for construction workers. "On Fair Ground 2" [5] trains people to help farmers take their health seriously and seek medical care. In 2008, Ireland became the first country in the world to launch a national strategy for men's health.

People like Daniel Kottke, a former flat mate of Steve Jobs and one of the first Apple employees, share insights into the inner workings of the legendary team. Andy Cunningham, who was sacked by Jobs a total of five times, also weighs in.

Women who become doctors choose their profession to heal people. But in hospitals, they often become victims of sexual harassment. This film features case studies from Switzerland.

From obscene jokes by powerful bosses in the operating room to sexual blackmail and assaults during training: in this film, female students, doctors, and surgeons recount what they have had to endure. In an environment still marked by a culture of silence, harassers are rarely punished by their superiors.

Often, victims are reluctant to file a complaint for fear of jeopardizing their careers. Some take the risk and report the incidents to human resources, but these complaints are seldom followed up. Although hospitals claim to have a zero-tolerance policy, harassers rarely experience any negative consequences.

An integration experiment, in the heart of Germany: Refugees move into a vacant hotel, where they receive targeted support. The aim is for them to find work or a training placement, ultimately fostering a successful integration.

An empty hotel in downtown Düsseldorf is ready for a new idea. Karin Jungjohann has one - and isn't afraid to experiment.

"What do people need most, no matter where they come from? A sense of hope for the future," said Karin Jungjohann, one of the founders of the Düsseldorf language school "Hispi". For years, she had observed how refugees in accommodation centers struggle to progress in their lives. At the same time, she was being approached by restaurateurs in Düsseldorf looking for people to fill jobs in the catering industry. This gave rise to the idea for a project designed to rethink the accommodation, support and integration of refugees: the House of Friends.

A film crew follows the initiator of the integration experiment from the initial selection of participants, through to their successful integration into the labor market and society.

The largest Jewish retirement and nursing home in Germany is in Frankfurt am Main. People who survived the Holocaust and yet decided to grow old in the land of the perpetrators still live here, today.

This is a place where moving life stories come together: of flight, survival and the desire to grow old with dignity. Today, the retirement home is home to more than 170 people, around three quarters of whom are Jewish. There is also a daytime care program, which is open to senior citizens from outside the home. It offers social contact, activities and moments of joie de vivre.

92-year-old Eva Szepesi, born in Budapest, survived Auschwitz as a child and lost her entire family. Today she tells her story in schools. Despite her traumatic experiences, she has lived in Frankfurt for decades and now visits the home every week during the day. "I didn't even want to come to Germany," she says. Like her, many residents have been brought here by fate.

Twenty refugees from Ukraine, such as Bella Kiselova and her daughter Marina, have also found shelter here.

Today, the home has grown into an intercultural community, characterized by many nationalities and non-Jewish employees. It is a place that offers security, in times when anti-Semitism is on the rise again worldwide. The community also provides support: through maintaining traditions, hosting celebrations, observing the weekly Sabbath and providing space for commemorating together.

The documentary sensitively accompanies Jewish and refugee people as they go about their everyday lives at the home. It also paints a picture of a place that is characterized by pain, hope, humor and joie de vivre.

Constant stimuli, digital distractions - how can we stay focused these days? Does talent, training, or technology help? Neuroscientists and mental coaches show how concentration works in the brain.

In an increasingly demanding world, we seem to be able to concentrate less and less. How does our brain manage to focus, even when we're constantly exposed to distractions? This documentary accompanies a top athlete, an air traffic controller trainee, and an e-sports professional on their journeys in search of maximum focus.

Swimming world champion Angelina Köhler has to be fully focused for a certain number of seconds to win a race. How does she prepare for this? According to Angie Köhler, the mind is crucial: "The sequences we train in swimming are so precise and technical that if you're not focused, you can't perform them quickly. If you can't concentrate properly, you lose."

Jan Peter Konopinsky is a trainee air traffic controller. He has to maintain his concentration for several hours at a time. He can't afford to make mistakes, because human lives depend on him.

Dennis "Denninho" Malcherczyk is an "eFootballer" playing in the virtual Bundesliga. He trains for several hours every day. He, too, must be fully focused: His success depends on his reaction speed, analytical skills, and ability to recall hundreds of key combinations at the right moment. Does his talent for multitasking help him?

Once each of these three subjects have created the right training and working environment for themselves, things sometimes go so well that they forget time, space, and everything around them. Then, they're in the flow.

Flow is considered a mental state of complete immersion, a state of highest concentration. It's a chief field of interest for researchers like Prof. Dr. Corinna Peifer from the University of Lübeck. She's investigating how flow can be measured, among other things.

Neuroscientist Dr. Henning Beck and 'mental coach' Thomas Baschab observe the three subjects, describing what's happening in their bodies and minds. Their insights are valuable to anyone wanting to improve their own concentration.

She's an 'own voice' author writing about her own personal experience, in stories that satisfy the hunger for authentic narratives. Topics such as mental health, body positivity and ADHD are close to her heart. Kim is nervously awaiting the release of her latest book, which ventures into new territory: the focus is no longer on a single woman, but on a young married couple. Will this story also resonate with her fans?

The Riekes are living their dream in Jever: right in the center of town, they've opened a shop dedicated to the New Adult phenomenon. The young entrepreneurs are also a couple in their private lives and post clips on social media as a comedy duo. For them, just as for Kim and Jess, attending the Frankfurt Book Fair is the highlight of the year. But traditional critics at events like these are generally skeptical of these modern literary formats, no matter how vibrant they may be. Can the couple hold their own?

Three men, a hydrogen balloon, and a shared dream of reaching the North Pole. In 1897, the Andrée expedition vanished without a trace. It wasn't until 1930 that their preserved bodies, diaries, and photographs were discovered on Kvitøya.

At the end of the 19th century, the North Pole was a blank spot on the map — a symbol of adventure, glory, and scientific progress. On July 11, 1897, Swedish nationals August Salomon Andrée, Nils Strindberg, and Knut Frænkel began their expedition to the North Pole. Starting from the Svalbard archipelago, north of Norway, the three set out in a hydrogen balloon. The whole world was watching; their homeland held its breath. After carrier pigeons delivered some optimistic messages, contact was suddenly lost. Thirty-three years of radio silence followed.

In early August 1930, following a summer of significant ice retreat, seal hunters on the island of Kvitøya, the "White Island" in the far north of the Svalbard archipelago, stumbled upon the expedition's remains. In the snow lay well-preserved bodies, as well the group's equipment: hundreds of items, including morphine and opium, intact notebooks and rolls of film, 93 of which were recovered.

What do these photographs and carefully kept diaries reveal about the expedition? How did the three men end up on this island — and how, when, and why did they die?

For almost forty years, it divided Germany, separating East and West. The day the Wall came down, on November 9, 1989, was a day of joy and happiness for the vast majority of people who lived in its vicinity.

So it's no wonder that almost everywhere along the 1,300-kilometer border between the Baltic Sea and the Vogtland region, people were eager to see this mark of division disappear.

The German state of Saxony-Anhalt was no exception. Between Altmark and Oberharz, border posts and metal fences, watchtowers and even the paths patrolled by the border guards disappeared. People on both sides of the dividing line resumed old relationships, or built new ties.

Nature was allowed to reclaim the border area. It became the "Green Belt", a unique natural area established on December 9, 1989. This natural paradise is also a place of remembrance.

Now, something new is taking place along this "Green Belt." The border, which people once wanted to forget, is coming into focus once again. People in the villages along the former inner-German border now consider the old barrier to be part of their local history. This is especially true of the generation born around the time that the Wall fell.

On a journey through the former border area, the film introduces viewers to people who want to remember, and the projects they are undertaking to achieve this. Where does this new interest in the old border come from?

Help for Single Parents**

For many single parents, everyday life can be a challenge. But a number of projects offer assistance and encouragement. Affordable housing, social networking, and childcare services are designed to ease the burden. Single parents in Europe can increasingly rely on help and support from people, associations, and institutions to help them balance raising children with work, financial issues, and mental overload.

"A secure, affordable living situation - that's such a key issue in the lives of single parents," says Sarah Zeller. A few years ago, she found herself confronting this issue when, along with another friend and her child, she decided to set up a shared apartment for the two single parent families. But they searched in vain for an affordable apartment with enough space.

This predicament gave rise to an innovative approach. In 2015, the German native founded the non-profit association JUNO in Vienna. Working with property developers, the association plans and develops compact and affordable apartments for single parents. With her idea, the founder has now helped over 160 families find a suitable apartment.

The Belgian region of Wallonia has set itself the goal of strengthening the social position of single parents. Amandine Dedoncker is a social worker involved in the "Relais Familles Mono" program, creating services tailored to the needs of single parents. The government program enables single parents to learn practical skills, meet other mothers or fathers, and be part of a community. As a population group particularly affected by loneliness, this is extremely important for single parents' mental health.

When other families have free time, on Saturdays Bianka Baumann is at work: in a supermarket in Rostock. The single mother and sales assistant works weekends. But who looks after her son Linus, during a time when most daycare centers are closed? An innovative daycare center here makes her weekend work possible by offering overnight care for parents who work night shifts.

All of this is financed by the state of Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania. A model that supports single parents - and makes it possible to truly balance work and family life.

The Mölln Letters**

In 1992, three people died in an arson attack carried out by neo-Nazis in Mölln, northern Germany. They were relatives of İbrahim Arslan, who was seven years old at the time. The film follows the family as they come to terms with their trauma.

İbrahim survived the fire, but lost his sister, cousin and grandmother. In the wake of the Mölln attacks, the town received thousands of letters of solidarity. They were archived - and forgotten for almost three decades.

Woven into İbrahim's moving quest to uncover the past and his encounters with three of the letter-writers, the rediscovered letters form a visual and emotional bridge between the past and the present. The film follows İbrahim and his siblings, painting a sensitive portrait of a trauma that continues to shape their lives to this day.

For İbrahim, coming to terms with the past means one thing above all else: fighting racism and championing a culture of remembrance centered on the perspectives of those affected. His brother Namik, on the other hand, is only beginning to process the trauma of their shared experiences.

The film also uncovers a powerful sense of solidarity - one that the victims and survivors were not previously aware of. The film is a plea for a new form of remembrance, one that takes the voices of survivors seriously and finally gives them the space and recognition they deserve.

Colors make our homes more beautiful. They make our clothes more stylish. And colors are indispensable for art. But what looks beautiful can also be toxic: Many colors contain substances like mercury, lead, or chromium. The production of colors pollutes soil and water. Toxins can get onto our skin via our clothing. Textile dyeing has a particularly devastating impact in Asia. In countries like Bangladesh, China, and India, wastewater is often discharged into rivers without being filtered. "Basically, the textile industry dumps all its waste into the river," says biologist Jim Ajioka.

Along with his colleague Orr Yarkoni, Jim Ajioka has founded a start-up in Cambridge, England. Their aim is to revolutionize the textile market. "Our vision is to completely eliminate the use of toxic chemicals," he says. To achieve this, the visionaries are relying on biological processes and microbes that can dye fabrics.

Paints made from natural raw materials such as stones and minerals: that's David Kremer's specialty. At his paint mill in Aichstetten in the Allgäu region, he produces paints according to traditional methods and rediscovers long-forgotten shades. Renowned museums such as the Louvre in Paris and the Prado in Madrid use his paints for the restoration of paintings. Many artists also find very special and rare tones in his collection.

A new project is taking David Kremer to Greece. There, he's searching for a mine for a mineral that was used to produce color pigments in ancient times.

In the Netherlands, Jeanet Marit Herbst knows that colors can even be beneficial to health. The color expert is redesigning the interiors of large clinics in Germany, the Netherlands, and other European countries. Her work shows that colors can lower blood pressure, lift a person's mood, and help reduce medication use. "Color does everything," says Herbst. "It heals, supports, and provides stability."

The picturesque Bavarian Alps, beloved by mountaineers and hiking enthusiasts. But overconfidence or sudden weather changes can create emergencies. Then, mountain rescuers are the last hope.

On the Blaueis ("blue ice") Glacier, a young mountaineer is in distress. Alone when a thick fog rolls in, he's unable to continue. A team from the Ramsau Mountain Rescue Service sets out immediately, but the fog becomes a problem for them as well. The mountain rescuers' keen sense of direction is put to the test: Two teams search from different directions for the man, who is likely already severely hypothermic.

A hiker has fallen 40 meters in the Bavarian Alps. The air rescue team prepares to fly to the accident site using a helicopter. There's no information yet on the condition of the victim. But experience dictates that in a fall from this height, the rescuers should prepare for the worst.

Both missions end well. But that is not always the case. The memory of Peter Hildebrandt, former head of operations in Ramsau, is ever-present. He fell to his death during a mission. The mountain rescuers are always aware that they, too, are risking their lives.

For some he's a hero. For others, he's public enemy number one. Certainly, his revelations challenged US power. This film follows the WikiLeaks founder's extraordinary life story.

With the publication of thousands of secret US military and diplomatic documents in 2010, WikiLeaks ushered in a new information age. Suddenly, thanks to founder Julian Assange, state secrets were out in the open - and under scrutiny.

For many journalists and activists, Assange was a pioneer who used new technologies to evade both censorship and reprisals. For others, he symbolized an openness that could bring both nation states and multinational corporations to their knees.

For seven years, Assange sought refuge in the Ecuadorian embassy in London. After that, he spent five years in a British high-security prison facing US charges of espionage carrying a potential sentence of 175 years. Following a deal with the US Department of Justice, he was finally released in the summer of 2024.

The film tells the story of Julian Assange and asks the question: in a world of radical change, what remains of the fight for truth?

Italy's New Farmers

Astonishing new data from the Italian farmers' association: More and more young people are moving away from cities to rural areas in order to work in farming. For many, it's an active choice to change career.

The association says the number of young farmers in Italy has risen by 13 per cent over the last 10 years, more than anywhere else in Europe. One of these new farmers is the young Roman Giacomo Lepri. After graduating with a degree in ethnology, like many young Italians he struggled to find a job. Instead of going abroad, he founded the Cooperativa Agricola Coraggio. Now, he is fighting to have unused public land in the city of Rome allocated to young farmers. He hopes to join forces with like-minded people to organically farm the abandoned Borghetto San Carlo estate.

Rome has been Italy's largest owner of agricultural land since antiquity. Giacomo Lepri's campaign is aimed at changing urban policy, so that the capital's agricultural heritage can be tapped to create jobs for young farmers. In the steep hills around the city of Genoa there's also plenty of agricultural land -abandoned because cultivating it is a challenge. When Davide Moro and Matteo Rizzitano decide to quit their jobs at a car body repair shop, finding land to farm wasn't a problem. Nevertheless, the path for these new young farmers in Rome and Genoa has been strewn with obstacles. Despite EU goals to promote urgently-needed generational change in agriculture, securing long-term financial resources is difficult for small businesses like these.

Still, the two men say there's no chance they're giving up. The career changers aren't just motivated by Italy's high youth jobless rate, but also by a desire for self-determined work close to nature.

The psychological distress experienced by children and adolescents who feel they have been born as the wrong gender is immense. It can even lead to suicide. But is gender reassignment at a young age the right decision? "Whatever created my body simply made a mistake in the production process," explains Kira. The 17-year-old was born a boy. Five years ago, she came out to her parents: "I'm a girl." After the initial shock, Kira's parents wondered how they could help their child—because puberty was just around the corner, with facial hair growth and a changing voice. "We asked ourselves: But what if it's just a phase?" recalls Kira's mother. Should they agree to medical interventions—or wait and see and do nothing? Both can cause harm. A dilemma.

Interventions involving hormone treatments and gender-affirming surgeries have side effects. That's why children and parents should be certain that the trans identity is permanent before starting therapy. After all, there are also phases of adolescence in which children and teens experiment with gender roles—without being trans. How can you tell the difference? And what's best for your own child?

This documentary explores the search for answers. Filmmaker Renate Werner accompanies three families as they navigate these difficult decisions. She approaches the adolescents with sensitivity and helps make their motivations understandable. She speaks with experts about the still-emerging field of trans research and what science currently knows about trans identity.

Climate Refugees - A Global Challenge**

Over the past 10 years, climate change has displaced an average of 70,000 people, every day. This, according to figures from the UN Refugee Agency, UNHCR. Poorer countries are particularly hard hit.

There is no universal legal framework that would offer these people protection. Climate-induced displacement is not recognised as a valid ground for asylum under the Geneva Convention. Now, three countries in Latin America, the Pacific and Asia are responding to an emergency that directly affects each of them.

One of these countries is Bangladesh. It is one of the places most severely affected by climate change. In 2024, around 2.4 million people in Bangladesh became internally displaced. Most of them lost their homes due to a natural disaster. Cyclones and tropical storms cause devastating damage, while rising sea levels are flooding mangrove forests and agricultural land. Melting glaciers in the Himalayas are causing flooding along the rivers. In new model villages, communities displaced by soil erosion and salinization are being provided with accommodation and land.

In Colombia, pressure from lawyers led to the legal recognition of the first victims of climate change. The historic ruling recognizes that displacement is not only caused by violence and armed conflict, but also by environmental factors.

In the Pacific, regional solidarity is being prioritized in the face of rising sea levels, which threaten the very existence of several nations. At the same time, policy is shaped by a recognition of the deep ties people have to their homeland and their history. For people here, leaving would be tantamount to exile.

In places like Turkey, Vietnam, or Mexico, they gain practical experience, earn money, and yet remain fresh for the western market. A models' reach on social media is also becoming increasingly important. Having many followers is a clear advantage when it comes to landing good jobs.

From March 1976, Argentina was ruled for several years by a military junta led by General Jorge Videla. Some 30,000 people were abducted and murdered by the regime's security forces. Many of their children disappeared - but where did they go?

Following the military coup in 1976, a systematic campaign of repression began. Around 30,000 Argentinians were abducted and murdered by the security forces - including some 500 women who were pregnant or had recently given birth. For years, no one knew what had happened to the children of these 'disappeared' women. Had they perished along with their mothers? Or had they perhaps survived?

After searching for many years, investigators made a shocking discovery: many of these children had been secretly adopted by families with links to the military, and raised under new identities. In some cases, they were living with people who had been involved in the crimes committed against their parents. The documentary traces the history of Argentina's disappeared children and follows families' ongoing search for truth, identity and justice. It focuses on the mothers and grandmothers who have been searching for their loved ones for decades, as well as the children themselves, now adults coming to terms with their origins and the circumstances of their past.

The human body is adaptable, resilient, and astonishingly capable — truly a "high-performance machine". Humans have always sought to test their limits. But how resilient are we really?

This film explores the tension between our bodies' impressive capabilities, and the moments when they clearly say 'enough is enough.' How resilient is the human body really? Where are its limits, and what happens when we cross them?

In his youth, Stefan Santifaller tested his physical capabilities so hard as a competitive athlete that he became seriously ill. Pushing physical limits can very quickly push a person to their mental limits as well. When that happened to Stefan Santifaller, it forced him to reorient his life.

Even in everyday life, we can reach our mental limits—whether due to worries in our personal lives or at work. When this type of overload happens, the body sends out signals, or "warning signs." Those affected often feel nervous, restless, depressed, tired, or weak. Sleeping problems, dizziness, muscle tension, anxiety, and mental blocks are possible. Rapid breathing, heart palpitations, or nausea can also follow.

Sometimes, we reach our limits involuntarily, as a stroke of fate bring us to a halt. Markus Rehm experienced this as a young person, when he lost his lower leg in an accident. Today he is a para-long jumper and the newly crowned world champion in his discipline.

He had to learn the hard way just how definitive physical limits can be, and how much energy — both physical and mental — it takes to chart a new course to circumvent seemingly-insurmountable barriers.

For some he's a hero. For others, he's public enemy number one. Certainly, his revelations challenged US power. This film follows the WikiLeaks founder's extraordinary life story.

With the publication of thousands of secret US military and diplomatic documents in 2010, WikiLeaks ushered in a new information age. Suddenly, thanks to founder Julian Assange, state secrets were out in the open - and under scrutiny.

For many journalists and activists, Assange was a pioneer who used new technologies to evade both censorship and reprisals. For others, he symbolized an openness that could bring both nation states and multinational corporations to their knees.

For seven years, Assange sought refuge in the Ecuadorian embassy in London. After that, he spent five years in a British high-security prison facing US charges of espionage carrying a potential sentence of 175 years. Following a deal with the US Department of Justice, he was finally released in the summer of 2024.

The film tells the story of Julian Assange and asks the question: in a world of radical change, what remains of the fight for truth?

2024 was a record year for Norwegian tourism, with almost 38.6 million overnight stays. The country's cuisine, culture, and unique destinations entice visitors. But tourism brings its own problems.

At a campsite in Stavanger, Per Arne Haarr is often forced to turn away tourists during the high season. Because reservations can't be made in advance, Robert, Yvonne, and their son Paul have arrived extra early. They hope to secure a spot at this campground in central Stavanger.

The family from Germany is on its second visit to Norway and hoping to explore the south of the country. It quickly becomes apparent that since their last visit, things have gotten much more crowded here.

Those who like hustle and bustle will get their money's worth along the Fargegaten pedestrian street, in the center of Stavanger. Then there's the harbor promenade - and, of course, the cruise ships. Up to three of these can moor here at the same time, bringing thousands of tourists to the city every day. This is a nuisance for residents who live in the old town. The ships right outside their front doors don't just obstruct the view. They also damage historic buildings and residents' health.

Just 40 minutes from Stavanger the crowds can be even more intense. This is the location of the Preikestolen or Pulpit Rock. Most tourists come to take a photo at the edge of the rock, which drops steeply, some 604 meters, into the fjord. When the weather's good, queues are almost guaranteed.

Bernt Hårvard Øyen, director of the Bryggen Foundation in Bergen, wants to find a better balance when it comes to tourism. His coastal city's historic harbor district is a UNESCO World Heritage Site -- and one of the most popular places to visit. In July, the tourist high season, it's sometimes so crowded here that walking is difficult. And not everyone behaves respectfully. Øyen says options for limiting the number of visitors are currently under discussion.

Many residents of the small town of Flåm on the Aurlandsfjord would probably welcome a visitor limit. When a cruise ship is in port, this village of 288 people turns into a kind of Disneyland. One of the main draws for tourists, in addition to the picturesque surroundings, is the Flåm Railway. It's considered one of the most beautiful train journeys in the world and attracts some 450,000 tourists to Flåm every year.

Yvonne, Robert and their son Paul have traveled here to see it. But is so much tourism really worth it?

In Sudan, the government is waging a bloody civil war against rebels. An estimated 12 million people have fled their homes, either to destinations within the country or to neighboring states. Many of them are seeking help in Chad.

It is arguably the world's biggest humanitarian crisis - yet the civil war in Sudan has received little attention from the international community.

The Sudanese civil war continues to escalate: Some 26 million people are starving. People here are dependent on humanitarian aid. But Europeans have cut aid payments, and, following the dismantling of the American aid program USAID, emergency aid workers in Sudan find themselves slowly running out of funds.

Working for the United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR), Sani Akilou is responsible for both the water supply and hygiene in the refugee camps in Chad. But he lacks money for even the most basic things. As a result, drinking water is a brown broth, and in some cases there are no toilets for thousands of people.

Sani tries to get a sooty generator repaired to produce electricity for the pumps supplying water to 40,000 refugees. Meanwhile, the few doctors in the camps are fighting for the lives of the first people who have contracted cholera. If the disease continues to spread through contaminated water, thousands of people are at risk of death.

Sani's colleague Charlotte Lepiniec is responsible for education at the UNHCR. Reading, writing, arithmetic - these things seem almost irrelevant when there's not enough money to fight hunger, disease, and death. But if half a million children stop learning long-term poverty will become entrenched here.

Education is one of the keys to overcoming the crisis. But everything is in short supply: blackboards, pens, books, chairs, tables. Sometimes, there are over 100 pupils in a class. Teachers haven't been paid for four months. Nevertheless, they continue to teach - even though they're going hungry like everyone else.

Food rations from the UN World Food Programme have already been drastically reduced. The budget for global emergency aid administered by the German Foreign Ministry has also recently been cut by more than half, to around one billion euros.

The film is a journey into a little-noticed region of the world where the consequences of reduced emergency aid are dramatic. It shows how dedicated aid workers try to save lives, despite having very little money to do so.

Challenging Traditional Gender Roles in Italy

Every year, the Italian town of Viterbo honors its patron saint, Santa Rosa, with a unique procession. A 30-metre-high sculpture has traditionally been carried through the town by more than 100 men. Now, women are challenging that exclusionary custom.

Viterbo is an Italian town with a centuries-old tradition. Every year, on 3 September, more than a hundred men carry the huge Macchina di Santa Rosa sculpture - standing almost 30 meters tall - through the old town. For many, this ritual is a defining part of their identity. But Viterbo is changing, and a new generation is questioning why this tradition is reserved for men.

At the heart of this development is 13-year-old Stella. She was the first girl to be accepted into the Mini-Macchina club - the first step for children hoping to one day become fully-fledged Macchina bearers. Now she's preparing for her most important challenge. For the first time, she's allowed to take part in what's known as the steep stage to the Santuario di Santa Rosa, a symbolic highlight of the ritual.

One of the bearers is Stella's father, David. He is very supportive of his daughter's dream - although it's unusual. Stella's cousin Matteo, on the other hand, sees the tradition from a male perspective. This contrast shows just how deeply rooted gender roles are in Viterbo.

A key figure in this quiet revolution is Gianni Baiocco. Himself a bearer, he is also the chairman of the Mini-Macchina association, located in the town's historic center. He was one of those who first allowed girls to join two years ago - a bold move that faced some local resistance. As he sees it, this development is about safeguarding tradition, in a sparsely populated area that faces a shortage of young people.

On the day of the Mini-Macchina parade, Viterbo is on the edge of its seat. The film shows just how far Stella's determination and strength will take her. But the question remains as to how far a centuries-old, male-dominated tradition is prepared to open up. This is a report on courage, cultural heritage and the transformation of a city caught between faith, tradition and a new generation.
